SUN SAFETY

With the very warm weather of recent weeks we would like to remind you please to ensure that your child has adequate sun protection whilst at school. In the second half of the summer term we like to get outside den building, using the sports field and generally making the most of our lovely school grounds. Although we have a shade sail and lots of shady areas in the playgrounds under the trees, children do like to run around and we therefore advise that you apply suncream before school on sunny days, and that you send your child to school with a sunhat to protect them.

We do have a quantity of school sunhats for sale at £3.00 if you need one. If your child is able to apply their own suncream they may bring a named tube to school to top up protection if needed. THANK YOU.



SCHOOL SECURITY PROCEDURES

Over the half term break we replaced the front, rear and front corridor doors in school in order to upgrade our school security systems to current required standards.

There are now locks on all three doors to enable us to restrict access to the corridor and classrooms, ensuring that the children are as safe as they can possibly be whilst in school.

A REMINDER PLEASE that it is essential for safeguarding and fire evacuation purposes that we know who is in school at all times. Parents: please therefore deliver children to teachers through exterior classroom doors or if you are dropping children between 8.30 and 8.45 to the office through the front door. To safeguard our children, parents and visitors must not be unsupervised in the corridors or children's cloakrooms at any time.
